REGULATIONS FOR THE HEBRON VILLAGE AND PRATT CEMETERIES

Eligibility

Hebron Village Cemetery:

1. A fulltime resident for two years or blood relatives and spouses of anyone buried in the cemetery may have a lot in the cemetery assigned for use of the family (husbands, wives and dependent children) when the need arises or upon an approved written request to the Selectmen.
2. Former residency does not make one eligible. However, residents who move to an assisted care facility or other locations outside of Hebron due to illness, or the inability to care for themselves, may, with the approval of the Selectmen, be considered as a resident for the purposes of meeting the requirements of these regulations.
3. Residents, without dependant children, who die or have space approved by the Selectmen will be assigned single or double grave sites.

Pratt Cemetery:

1. No more full lots will be assigned in the cemetery.
2. A fulltime resident of Hebron for two years, or blood relatives and spouses of anyone buried in the cemetery may have a single or double grave site assigned when the need arises or upon an approved written request to the Selectmen.

Rules

1. The cemeteries have been divided into lots for eight or fewer graves.
2. The Selectmen, with the advice of the Cemetery Committee, will resolve any questions, conflicts, or requests for waiver of these rules.
3. Once a lot has been used and the holder of the lot is no longer a resident of Hebron, the unused grave sites will be held for a period of fifty years for his heirs. However, if application is made to the Selectmen, and approved, grave sites may be reserved for specific family members beyond this time.
4. The selectmen will assure that the plot books of the cemeteries are kept up to date and that one copy is kept in their safe and the other with the sexton or in some other location.
5. It is the responsibility of the burial site requestor to install four inch square and one foot deep cement or granite markers placed at the four corners of each lot within one year of the assignment. Failure to do this will result in the loss of the assigned burial plots.
6. Each grave shall have a headstone placed within one year showing the name and dates of birth and death of the deceased.
7. Tombs for above ground burials are allowed and will meet all the requirements of markers and stones in regard to showing the name and dates of birth and death of the deceased.
8. All markers, stones and tombs will be set level with the ground and the placing will be under the supervision of the Cemetery Committee or the Sexton.
