CHARLES BEAN SANCTUARY

Marine Patrol was diligent instructing people not to trespass on the beach/sand bar this summer. HCC still has strong concerns about people trespassing/landing on the narrow beaches bordering the south and western borders of the area. One option which was discussed was the use of buoys such as those used in 'no wake zones' and 'loon nesting' areas were discussed and will be researched this winter. The Selectboard's suggestion of piling downed trees/branches on beach will be addressed with the Board this fall and winter.

Charles Bean Sanctuary Baseline Documentation Report

Members reviewed materials which have been gathered for this report including Rick Van de Poll's Rapid Ecological Assessment, the deed to CBCA, documents from the original transfer of the property and others. At the next meeting, members will continue putting this document together after studying Dr. Van de Poll's REA. Monitoring protocol form will also need to be completed to assure good stewardship of the property. The property should be monitored at least once a year by volunteer steward (s).

Members discussed a workday for invasive species at the entrance of the Town Forest. Suzanne volunteered to send a doodle poll out to HCC members with a few dates to choose from.

NH Association of Conservation Commission's annual meeting will be held via Zoom on November 6. Members may choose from many different workshops. If members pay in advance, the town will reimburse them.

Grafton County Conservation District Annual meeting will be held October 13.
