Cardigan. Due to development and logging, the access off of Valley View Road is a challenge. His goal is work with landowners and try to get a trailhead developed in the area. TOWN FOREST: Barbara Richter from NHACC gave a few recommendations for trail work professionals. Lew Shelley who did the bridges on the Spectacle Pond Trail a few years ago was on the list. Martha will reach out to him.

BUDGET: Suzanne and Martha presented the HCC draft budget to the Selectboard last week. Requested \$5,000. Big projects for 2023 include professional trail work, beaver deceiver for town forest wetland which is flooding the road/trail, possible moving of gate at bridge, seminars to attend or sponsor. Funds remaining in the Conservation Commission account will be used for hazard tree removal in the Town Forest prior to close of current fiscal year (June 30, 2023.

CHARLES BEAN SANCUARY – Winter monitoring has not yet been done. Weather has been mild and there is uncertainty about walking on ice. Next cold spell we will mobilize and monitor as much area as we can.
